




Kateřina Ondrušková was born in 1991 in Uherské Hradiště, Czech Republic, and recently graduated from the Academy of Fine Arts in Prague in the class of Josef Bolf. In 2020, Ondrušková took part in an internship at the Berlin studio of conceptual artist, Robert Barta (1975, Prague).

Ondrušková processes natural motifs, especially flowers. Her art is deeply personal, focusing primarily on her own thoughts as well as melancholic fragments from her memory. She replaces specific natural formations with ambigous signs, words or abbreviations instead of visualisation. During her graduation, she was primarily interested in gardens, while her most recent works were inspired by her travels in the Middle East. Her trips to Jordan led to three thematic cycles, while her series SAD ROCK became an essential archetype for her further search for organic forms.


As she says, "I perceive the stone as a souvenir that one takes with them, for example, as a good luck charm or as a memory of a place. My research subject is enriched with a memorabilia map, adding inscriptions to the stones."














































































